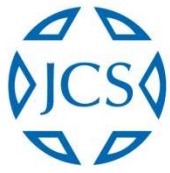

Jewish Community Services

In 2006, THE ASSOCIATED convened a Visioning Task Force to undertake a thorough, wide-ranging analysis of emerging trends in our community and to make recommendations for appropriate responses, all in the spirit of planning as carefully for our community's future as our ancestors planned for us.

One outcome of this very thorough and thoughtful community analysis was the decision to consolidate existing social services under one umbrella. As a result, four agencies — Jewish Family Services, Jewish Vocational Service, Jewish Addiction Services, and Jewish Big Brother/Big Sister League — with rich histories of service (the oldest dates back to 1856) have joined together to form **Jewish Community Services (JCS)**. By uniting these agencies into a seamless, integrated human service organization, JCS can more effectively respond to diverse, multi-dimensional needs of those in our community.

The mission of JCS reflects the needs identified in our community: "Through the programs and services of Jewish Community Services, families and individuals will be supported in meeting basic needs for economic sufficiency; in living independently, in achieving mental health and competence; and in feeling supported by and connected to the Jewish community in ways that are meaningful to them."

Jewish Community Services offers:

- Mental health services, including psychotherapy, psychiatric services, and addictions treatment
- Services to people with special needs such as counseling, community based support and residential services
- Career services to assist those seeking to find a job or enhance their career skills and for those wanting to start or further build a business
- Service coordination to help families, seniors and émigrés access resources and assistance
- Safety net services such as financial assistance and the Jewish Community Food Fund
- Short term consultation services to assist people in addressing normative life issues
- Support groups
- Teen outreach programs and services
- Prevention education programs related to Addictions and HIV/AIDS
- Jewish Big Brother/Big Sister matches
- A pro bono legal clinic
- Volunteer opportunities that help support client and agency needs
- Resources for seniors, caregivers, adults, parents, and more
